## George Turner WALDEGRAVE MBE (1889–1966) (Colony Commissioner 1921–1934)

One of the great Chief Commissioner in Hong Kong Scouting history is our 4th Colony Commissioner Rev. George Turner Waldegrave. He was the second son of Samuel Waldegrave and Alice Millett. His father was the son of another Samuel, an Anglican Bishop of Carlisle and a great - grandson of George, the 4th Earl Waldegrave, brother to William, 1st Baron Radstock. He was born in 1889 and died in 1966.

When he retired in 1934, the Hong Kong Government Gazette announced on 4 June 1934 under Gazette Notice No. 438 that
