Date	2 – 6 February 2027 (All participants are expected to arrive the campsite in the morning on 2 February 2027 and leave after lunch on 6 February 2027)
Venue	National Adventure Institute, Pachmarhi, Madhya Pradesh, INDIA
Activities	Rock climbing, rappelling, trekking, camping, encountering of obstacles, valley crossing, zip-line, sky cycling, horse riding, rifle shooting, archery, survival skills, water activities and many more challenging and thrilling adventurous activities, sightseeing by Gypsy. Para-sailing, hotair-ballooning may also be added if weather permits.
Eligibility	Contingent Members : Scout Members aged from 12 to 18 with no less than 1 year experience after investiture. Leaders of Contingent : Scout Leaders aged 18 to 55 with no less than 2 years' experience after investiture. <i>(Participants should be physically and mentally fit and be able to trek for 10-15 km per day. Blood pressure problem, asthma and diabetes patients are not allowed to participate.)</i>
Camp Fee	USD 250 <i>(The fee includes inland transportation, food, event souvenirs, accommodation, medical assistance for the injury during the programme, equipments and other training expenses.)</i>
Air Ticket*	Around HKD 6,000 (round trip economy class excluding airport tax & relevant surcharges) <i>* The air ticket cost is for reference only. Purchase will be arranged based on the decision of the Contingent Leader (EITHER (i) group purchase, with the actual airfare to be confirmed at a later date, OR (ii) by the Contingent Members themselves at the Contingent Leader's direction). All Contingent Members should depart and return according to the Contingent Leader's arrangement.</i>
Remarks	➤ Applicants may be required to attend an interview for selection. Please note that all decisions regarding shortlisting and interview results are final, and no appeals will be entertained. ➤ Applicants, as well as the parents or guardians of applicants under the age of 18, are required to attend the briefing session as and when directed by the Contingent Leader and/or the International Branch. ➤ Applicants are required to possess a valid "Certificate of Swimming Test" when participating in any kind of water activities overseas. ➤ Priority will be given to leader applicants who wish to join the Contingent Management Team (CMT) of the Hong Kong Contingent. Please indicate areas of assistance you could offer to CMT in Part E (Skills & Interest) on P.2 of Form (IL/1). ➤ Participants are responsible for their personal outdoor activity gear, passage, medical and travel insurance, airport departure taxes, visa application (if applicable), bank charges, remittance difference, any additional charges for offsite activities, quarantine fee (if applicable), cost incurred by the host, personal and contingent's expenses as well as expenses arising from emergencies. ➤ Participants are advised to arrange their own travel insurance. ➤ Participants are responsible for ensuring that all their travel documents are valid and eligible for travelling as on the date of departure and for at least 6

	months thereafter, and that the appropriate visa(s) are included, if required. Fees paid will not be refunded due to any issues arising from travel documents, visas and/or personal reasons. ➤ If the participant withdraws after registration, the fees paid will not be refunded. ➤ Participants must attend all activities throughout the entire duration of the programme. Unauthorized departure, lateness, early dismissal, or leaving the group midway is strictly prohibited. ➤ Photographs and video recordings will be taken during the programme. These media may be used by the Association and the host for publicity, promotional materials, and official reports. ➤ The International Branch, Scout Association of Hong Kong reserves the right of final interpretation and decision on all matters regarding this Jamboree and its regulations. ➤ By submitting the application, applicants and their parents/guardians indicate that they have read and agreed to all the contents of this circular.
Application Procedure	(i) Submit the completed application form (IL/1) and the medical certificate and application form requested by the host to the International Branch. OR (ii) Submit the online application form, with the medical certificate and application form requested by the host and the signed copy of the Declaration & Recommendation Form to the International Branch. Applications of Youth Members and Leaders in Scout Groups must be endorsed by their respective Group Scout Leaders and District Commissioners. Applications of other Leaders must be endorsed by their respective Commissioners.
